ARIZONA HOUSING COALITION ANNOUNCES GRANT AWARDS TO 45 ORGANIZATIONS

PHOENIX, ARIZONA (January 30, 2024) - The Arizona Housing Coalition is pleased to announce that 45 Arizona housing programs and homeless service providers have been awarded a total of \$4,200,000 in funding through its Nonprofit Capacity Building Grants and High Impact Rural Solutions Grants initiatives, made possible thanks to American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding from the Arizona Department of Housing.
