History

In the early 1990s, organizations seeking to end homelessness decided to work together to combine knowledge and speak in a unified voice to bring more solutions to those who were impacted by homelessness. Over time, these organizations also focused on bringing more affordable housing to Arizona in an attempt to amplify their efforts. Now, the Arizona Housing Coalition is the largest statewide organization advocating for housing stability and homelessness solutions. More than 350 member organizations, national partners, and dedicated advocates all work together to provide every Arizonan with a safe, affordable place to call home.



Mission

As a collaborative leader in Arizona's housing landscape, we engage policymakers, service providers, and community members to shape our research, policy, education, and advocacy—advancing solutions across the full spectrum, from street homelessness to stable homeownership.

- **EDUCATE:** Housing and homelessness services are constantly evolving with policy and industry changes. To meet the changing needs of our members and other partners, we provide education and networking opportunities, in addition to our Annual Conference.
- **ADVOCATE:** We champion funding for affordable housing development and resources that address homelessness and housing instability. We keep our more than 350 organizational members informed about important policy and regulatory changes, as well as bills of relevance at the state and national level.

Each aspect of our tagline, **Speaking Up for Home and Hope**, is aspirational.

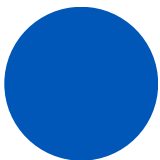
- **Speaking Up:** We aspire to be the leading, unified voice for housing and of the homeless communities in Arizona.

Acronym Use: After the official name is referenced in any document or conversation, it is permissible to refer to the organization as “AZHC.”

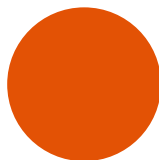
Colloquial Use: After the official name is referenced in any document or conversation, it is permissible to refer to the organization as “the Coalition.”

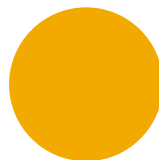

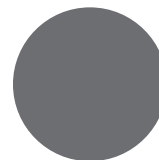

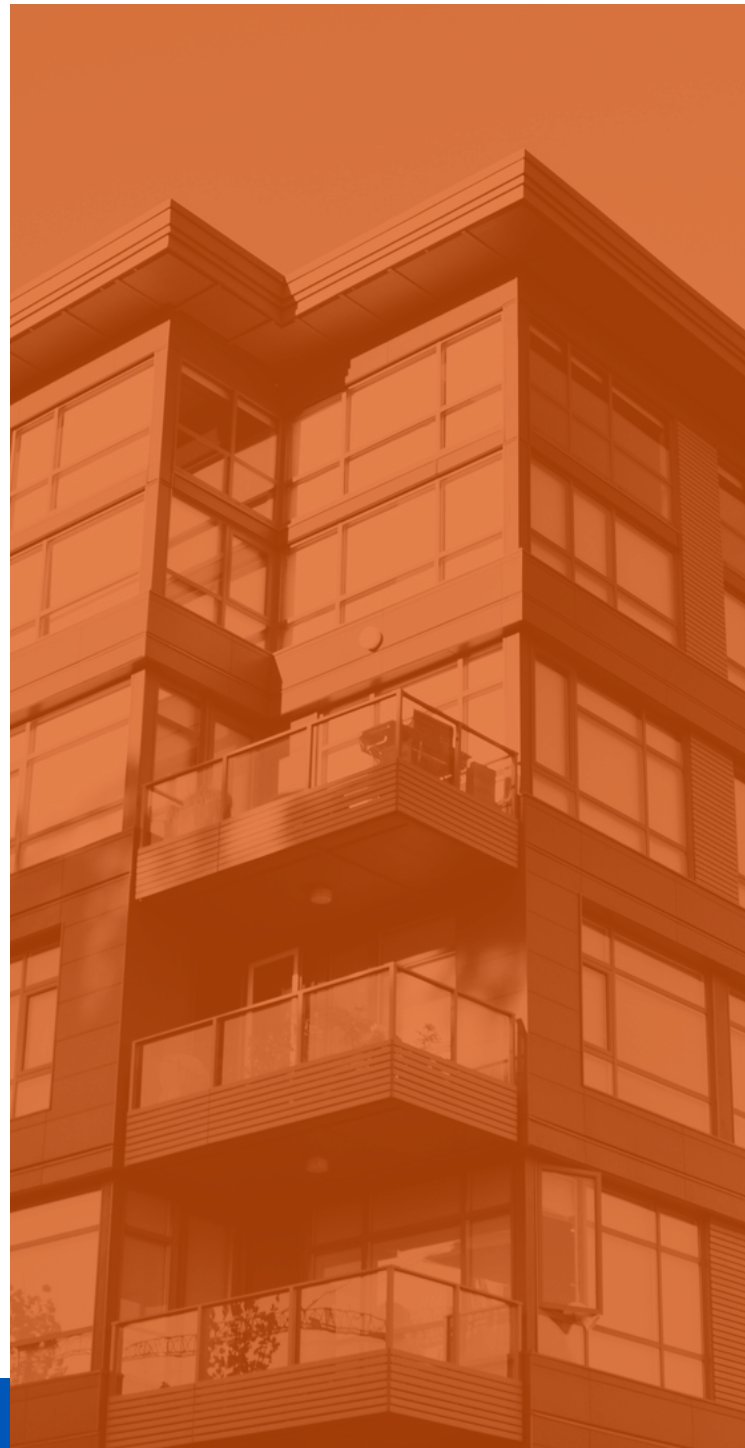
